TERMS AND CONDITIONS

These **Terms and Conditions** govern the submission, publication, and use of content in *Kaleidoscope: An Interdisciplinary Journal of Humanities and Social Sciences* (hereafter “the Journal”). By submitting a manuscript or using the Journal’s website, the user agrees to comply with these terms in full. The Journal reserves the right to modify or update these terms at any time without prior notice.

Definitions

- “**Author**” refers to any individual or group submitting a manuscript to the Journal.
- “**Article**” refers to any manuscript, paper, review, or other scholarly work submitted for consideration.
- “**Editor**” refers to members of the editorial board responsible for managing the review and publication process.
- “**User**” refers to any person accessing or using the Journal’s website or published materials.
- “**Publisher**” refers to the organization responsible for producing and maintaining the Journal.

Eligibility and Submission
